LRGH Is Proud To Be Named 1 Of The Hubs To Continue To Combat The Fight Against Opioid Misuse And Enhance Services.

Governor Chris Sununu on Tuesday identified the nine health care providers that will serve as hubs in the state's battle against opioid addiction, sharing \$8.8 million in federal funds over two years to coordinate drug abuse treatment and recovery programs in every region of New Hampshire.

The agreements with the nine hubs, expected to be ratified at a Governor and Council meeting on Oct. 31, will set the stage for deploying \$45 million in federal grants over the next two years to expand treatment services and enhance access. The existing 211 hotline for addiction services will also be enhanced as part of the initiative designed to create points of entry into the treatment system throughout the state.

"We know that through this grant, we will now be able to provide 24/7 access to clinicians for evaluations, training and education for local providers, and 24/7 access to Certified Recovery Workers in our Hub and in the LRGHealthcare Emergency Rooms " said Kevin W. Donovan, President and CEO of LRGHealthcare.
